- Some changes since it was first announced
- Businesses will have to show a decline of 15% (rather than 30%) in their revenue in
   March 2020 as compared to March 2019
- Businesses will have the option to choose to use the months of January and February to demonstrate the drop in revenue instead of comparing to the same month in 2019.
- · Charities and non-profits can choose to include or exclude government funding when calculating their revenues for the wage subsidy
- The PM is optimistic that the wage subsidy will be approved and implemented within three weeks
